Message from the CEO

Dear Friends.

At Maryville, we see the consequences of addiction every day - tearing families apart, destroying livelihoods, and disrupting communities. Thankfully, recovery is possible in even the most severe cases of addiction. Maryville's team of physicians, nurses and clinicians use a population health approach to inpatient treatment. This means we work to increase patient engagement in their healthcare, improve adherence to prescribed medication regimes and management of chronic health conditions such as diabetes and hypertension, and re-integrate the patient into the community. We offer a continuum of high quality addiction and co-occurring disorders treatment, including inpatient withdrawal management, residential and community based outpatient programs to restore hope, health and connections for long term recovery. We collaborate with physician offices, acute care facilities, the Veterans Administration and other government agencies, housing, and social support systems to help tens of thousands of people achieve sustained recovery all over the state.

Maryville staff and board take patient outcomes very seriously. During the past year, 95 percent of our patients stated they gained the skills needed to support their recovery. For the same period, Maryville's positive outcomes surpassed state averages in every category. Maryville received glowing comments as result of its recent Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF) triennial survey and received a Non-Profit Award from SJ Biz magazine last month.

Our growing alumni is a testament to the fact that treatment works and recovery is possible. Our goals for the year ahead are to expand our inpatient withdrawal management, short term and outpatient service sites and capacity, add long term programs and services, continue to upgrade our buildings and grounds, and add to our critical partnerships for continuing care throughout the state.

Maryville is in the business of saving lives. Our staff knows that success is achieved one patient at a time and that our positive reputation is not an entitlement, but something we need to earn every day. Our staff works tirelessly to individually and collectively excel in fulfilling our promise of healing with dignity and compassion. We need your help to continue our work. Over 300 people attended Maryville Addiction Treatment Center's annual Recovery for Life Gala and Silent Auction. The event was held at Tavistock Country Club in Haddonfield and featured special guest speaker and actor/producer/director Daniel Baldwin.

Frank Jones, Partner at Mints Insurance Agency, was honored with the Advocacy in Action Award for his passionate work in the addiction recovery field. Congressman Donald Norcross sent a proclamation that was presented with the award. As an addiction recovery advocate, Jones affects policy changes nationally for those with substance use disorder.

Baldwin was emphatic as he shared stories with the attendees about his own journey in recovery and those he now strives to help.

"We need to work harder to raise awareness and help those who struggle with this disastrous drug epidemic," said Baldwin. "Maryville should be proud of what they're doing because their effort is making a difference and it's exactly what everyone should be doing nationwide."

Maryville Expansion to Add 48 New Inpatient Treatment Beds

Maryville has just been awarded a contract from the Burlington County Board of Chosen Freeholders to establish a 48-bed inpatient program offering inpatient addiction and co-occurring disorders withdrawal management (detox), short and long term residential treatment programs for men at Post House, 610 Pemberton-Browns Mill Road in Pemberton, Burlington County, NJ. Maryville has increased its inpatient bed capacity twice since 2011 at its Williamstown campus, but demand for Maryville services has continued to grow.

This third expansion will add a second residential campus and increase Maryville's total bed capacity to 124, including 31 withdrawal management, 87 short term and 6 long term residential addiction and co-occurring disorders treatment beds. The staff is thrilled to be able to increase access to care essential in combating addictive disease. Our Admissions Department is open and accessible for individuals, families and our partners 365 days a year. Work is underway to prepare the building and grounds for use. The opening date of Maryville at Post House will be announced in the near future.
