Medical Legal Partnership grants through the Division of Mental Health and Addiction Services (DMHAS), launching this fall, and the Adolescent Substance Use grant through the Department of Children and Families (DCF), which will serve 100 youth each year.

Our commitment to accessibility is further reflected in the recent licensure of our new Voorhees outpatient site. We are currently finalizing payer contracts and eagerly anticipate beginning patient care soon, extending our integrated behavioral health and substance use services to another South Jersey community. We continue to expand access, enhance quality, and improve outcomes. Our new contact center is simplifying how individuals reach care and strengthening our connection to the communities we serve.

I am grateful to our board of directors, our dedicated staff, and our community partners for their trust, collaboration, and shared commitment to Maryville's mission. Together, we will continue to deliver integrated, compassionate care.

Where There's a Will, There's a Way

Amber Rodgers struggled with depression and anxiety early in life. As she got older, she found using substances helped combat those uncomfortable feelings, which ultimately led to her addiction. She was 14 when she began drinking and smoking marijuana. Amber's alcohol use became a major problem in her early 20s. She attended numerous detox, inpatient and outpatient programs with little success. After a brief period of sobriety, Amber relapsed last year. She

dropped out of college, lost her job, strained family relationships, and worst of all, lost custody of her daughter.

After a 15-year battle with addiction, Amber knew she needed to make a serious effort this time if she wanted her life to change. She came to Maryville and found it to be a welcoming place, first attending detox and moving on to outpatient for six months. She enjoyed getting to know the counselors, the variety the groups offered, and the community of her peers who were open and willing to share their stories. Amber found it comforting that many of the counselors are in recovery themselves. She worked hard in her program, and by consistently going to treatment, passing drug tests, staying sober, and receiving support from her counselor, she steadily rebuilt her life.

Amber shared, "I am now almost 15 months sober; I regained custody of my daughter in June; I'm working on becoming an assistant manager at my place of employment; I got engaged and just had a baby. None of that would be possible if I didn't put myself first and get sober." Amber also participates in Maryville's Alumni Services program, which offers recreational events, workshops, and ongoing supports for program graduates.

Maryville Alumni Gather Monthly for Support and Fun

Maryville Receives Primary Mental Health Outpatient Licenses

Maryville has provided co-occurring mental health services for decades. Now, we are licensed at both of our outpatient offices to provide primary mental health services. Adults and adolescents 11 years and older can come for services and meet with a licensed therapist and a psychiatric nurse practitioner. Services are available in both Turnersville and Vineland, as well as via telehealth. We also have focused programs for the LGBTQIA+ and Spanish-speaking communities. Our staff is excited to serve a wider scope of individuals and families through enhanced mental health programming!

Maryville's Impact in 2024

- Maryville served more than 12,000 individuals through inpatient and outpatient treatment, support services, and community programs.
- Maryville placed 900 clients in sober living housing throughout the state.

In client discharge surveys:

- 97% of Maryville clients stated they would recommend us to a friend or family member in need of services.
- 97% of Maryville clients felt they had gained the skills necessary to support their recovery.

In our Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC), where integrated substance use, mental health, and medical care is offered:

- 2,200 individuals received treatment and supportive services.
- 1,062 individuals obtained health insurance.
- 108 adolescents received treatment.

Through our LGBTQIA+ Outpatient Services:

- 105 clients were served.
- 96% of clients obtained / maintained stable housing.
- 84% of clients obtained / maintained stable employment.
- 97% of clients did not become involved with the criminal justice system.
- 8 clients made the decision to work in the substance use field and began their schooling while with us.

Through Peer Recovery Support Services:

- We completed 52 community trainings on naloxone.
- 338 clients were able to obtain their social security card, birth certificate, driver's license, or another form of identification.
- 1,015 clients obtained General Assistance and / or SNAP food benefits.
- 211 clients received employment assistance.
- 136 clients obtained health insurance.
- 207 clients were able to schedule medical appointments.
- 2,245 clients were provided transportation to treatment and supportive services.
- 517 clients were linked to recovery resources such as support groups.

Through our partnership with Rowan-Virtua School of Osteopathic Medicine:

- We connected 260 residential clients to HIV education, testing and counseling.

Through our partnership with Camden County:

- We offered resources for treatment to 3,293 individuals in homeless shelters, educating them on treatment options and providing the opportunity for placement.

Through our Family Education and Support Group:

- We facilitated 43 group sessions, assisting 292 people to better understand and cope with their loved ones' addiction.

Staff Spotlight on Jared Levy, New Maryville CEO



While Jared Levy may be new to the public as our Chief Executive Officer, Maryville staff have had the pleasure working with him for the past 10 years as Maryville's Chief Financial Officer and Chief Operating Officer. Jared can be found working at any one of our five sites,

always ready to roll up his sleeves to help where needed, work with staff to solve problems, or share news about his family. Jared and his wife Dawn have two daughters, 11 and 8 years old, and a son who is 5 years old. "At this stage of my life, I've fully embraced being a dad," Jared stated. "I love spending time with my kids whether that's cheering them on at sports activities, or taking family nature walks."

As CEO, Jared wants staff to know that his door is always open. "I believe in fostering an environment of openness and collaboration, where everyone feels heard and supported," Jared shared. He is looking forward to the challenges ahead. "Maryville has and will always be there to help people struggling with addiction and mental health issues. As the needs of the communities we serve change, Maryville will meet those needs with compassion and care," noted Jared.

Under Jared's leadership, Maryville will soon launch a third outpatient office in Voorhees, an Opioid Treatment Program (OTP) in Turnersville, a medical-legal partnership to provide legal services for our clients at our two outpatient locations in Turnersville and Vineland and our two inpatient offices in Williamstown and Pemberton, and expand adolescent services in Cumberland, Gloucester, and Salem counties.

Mission Statement

Maryville helps individuals and families improve their health and wellness by providing high quality integrated mental health, physical health, and substance use treatment, recovery supports, and education.

New Programs

Maryville was recently awarded **New Jersey Division of Mental Health and Addiction Services** funding to launch a Medical-Legal (MLP) Partnership, which is a collaboration between health care providers and attorneys that aims to tackle social needs impacting health. MLPs work to improve health equity by incorporating legal services into health care settings. MLPs can address legal needs such as housing, employment, immigration, and family law matters. They can also reduce stress, improve mental health, and improve treatment adherence. Services will be available at our Williamstown, Pemberton, Turnersville, and Vineland sites.

Maryville is proud to be counted among the **2025 Bristol Myers Squibb Foundation NJ SNIP** grant awardees. With this funding, we now offer a mental health treatment and support program specifically for the LGBTQIA+ population. The LGBTQIA+ community faces critical mental health disparities, driven by factors such as discrimination, social stigma, and a lack of culturally competent care. These challenges contribute to a range of mental health issues, including anxiety, depression, and post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). According to the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI), LGBTQIA+ adults are more than twice as likely as their heterosexual counterparts to experience a mental health condition, with nearly 60% reporting significant mental health challenges. This NJ SNIP grant allows us to provide targeted treatment in a safe environment by staff who are members of the LGBTQIA+ community.

Burlington County awarded Maryville the contract to operate their Burlington County Recovery Resource Center (RRC). Located in the Human Services Building in Westampton, this program offers individuals peer support, substance use disorder information and education, recovery support services, and linkages to other community resources in a supportive, substance-free environment. The RRC provides a warm, welcoming, safe and sober space. Individuals from all recovery backgrounds can come together to receive support, training, and social, educational, and recreational opportunities, as well as housing assistance. Classes may include topics such as wellness, nutrition, and illness management, self-care, stress management, financial management, literacy, employment, and parenting skills. The Burlington County Recovery Resource Center operates Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, to complement the Burlington Resource Recovery Center in Burlington City, which operates on Monday and Tuesday.

Maryville was awarded funding by the **New Jersey Department of Health** to provide harm reduction outreach services in Burlington County. This award allows us to travel to certain high-need areas in the county and provide naloxone (Narcan), Fentanyl test strips, Xylazine wound care, and a syringe access program, among other harm reduction efforts including education and linkages. According to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), studies show those who use syringe access programs have a much higher likelihood of entering treatment and discontinuing drug use. Harm reduction improves the overall well-being of individuals and communities, promoting safer choices in the interim.

The **New Jersey Department of Children and Families** awarded Maryville funding for expansion of adolescent substance use services in Burlington, Camden, Cumberland, Gloucester, and Salem Counties. The adolescent program serves individuals age 11 – 17.

New Jersey Department of Community Affairs granted Maryville seed funding to launch housing services and supports for homeless clients and clients at risk of becoming homeless. Funding has allowed us to bring a housing case manager on staff. Services include supports in the areas of housing stability, financial stability, life skills, community, and health and wellness.
